

2024 Emir HUS Winery - Turkey

Established in 2018 by Juan Pablo Diaz Leon and Ceylan Ertörer Diaz Leon, HUS Winery is a family-owned venture situated in Urla, on the outskirts of Izmir. The core philosophy of HUS revolves around crafting wines that authentically embody their roots. The winery's story traces back to the migration of Ceylan's grandmother from Crete to Urla during the population exchange in 1923.

Winemaker's Notes

The grapes were hand-harvested on September 26, 2024, from vines that thrive in Cappadocia's continental climate, where hot days and cool nights help preserve natural acidity. Fermentation took place in a combination of stainless steel and concrete tanks, with 20% of the volume undergoing 28 days of skin contact to enhance texture and aromatic depth. Emir, which accounts for roughly 25% of Cappadocia's total grape production, flourishes in the region's elevated terrain and its mineral-rich, volcanic soils. Known for its oval, green-yellow grapes, Emir produces wines that are delicate, pale yellow, and light to medium-bodied, marked by vibrant acidity and subtle minerality.

Tasting Notes

Aromas of lime and citrus, coupled with a medium to high acidity, culminate in a refreshing and mineral finish. Ideal for pairing with fish and seafood.

About the Region

Cappadocia is a significant region in Turkey's viticulture and grape cultivation. Due to the characteristics of its terrain, the region is incredibly conducive to the production of high-quality grapes. Sand, sandstone, and decomposed volcanic tuff make up the region's soil and help to produce grapes of high quality that are used to make wine. Nearly 20% of all Turkish wine is made in the Cappadocia region.



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
